- Sewer Authority – it is the goal of the borough to file an Act 537 with East Vincent as a Joint Authority. This is a huge endeavor but one that will still give council a say in rates and minimize the cost in the form of tax increases to residents.

I am proud to be a Republican in Spring City as I can see the impact of using Republican views and values to improve the quality of life in our residents without increasing taxes.
